

With 37 years of experience, David's expertise includes environmental impact assessments and mitigation, site excavation, remediation, site survey, geophysical surveying, and report writing.

He has conducted environmental studies throughout Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and northwestern Ontario. David has extensive knowledge of designing field objectives, implementing field reconnaissance and reporting requirements that are necessary for environmental assessment projects including hydro generating stations, hydro transmission lines, fibre optic cable installation, soil remediation, and highway development.

David has participated in a number of oral history projects for First Nation land entitlements and/or compensation, site protection, cemetery restoration and as part of land-use studies for Environmental Assessment Studies. He has prior experience in public consultation and presentation, and participated in designing and developing interpretive displays for cultural centres.

During the course of David's varied career, he has recorded a number of steamboat wrecks and ferry landing sites along the Red and Assiniboine rivers in southern Manitoba, as well as at Port Nelson in the Nelson River estuary in northern Manitoba.

David has also developed geophysical survey techniques to locate buried features such as former buildings foundations/footings, underground utility conduits, underground storage tanks, unmarked burials, contaminated soil plumes, etc. The non-intrusive nature of geophysical surveying provides data for areas that require remediation, avoidance, geotechnical drilling locates, and/or mitigation.
